




Chain, looking from the top.



Chain, looking from the underneath




Chain, looking straight on




Foundation row: working into front and back loop (insert hook from bottom to top)




Foundation row: working into front and back loop



Foundation row: working into back loop only




Foundation row: working into back loop only ...much looser




Foundation row: working into front loop only ...you end up seeing the underneath of the chain



Foundation row: working into front loop only ...and it's a bit scrappy




Beyond the foundation row, you work into front and back loops.





Heights of crochet stitch

Heights of crochet stitch

The turning chain is worked at the end of a row to bring the start of the new row up to the correct height.


Double crochet = 1 turning chain

Half treble crochet = 2 turning chain

Treble crochet = 3 turning chain


Double treble crochet = 4 turning chain





The stitch includes the height plus the chain on the top going in the direction of work
